**Abstract** A 4-yr follow-up of 46 boys (average age 13 yrs) discharged from a therapeutic camp between its inception in 1972 and September 1975 indicates an overall improvement in functioning, especially in the areas of school performance, interpersonal relationships, and household behavior. The one area in which no overall improvement was found was delinquency. 55% of the parents said their child had been arrested or in trouble with the law prior to admission; the percentage arrested or in trouble with the law following discharge was 55%.
